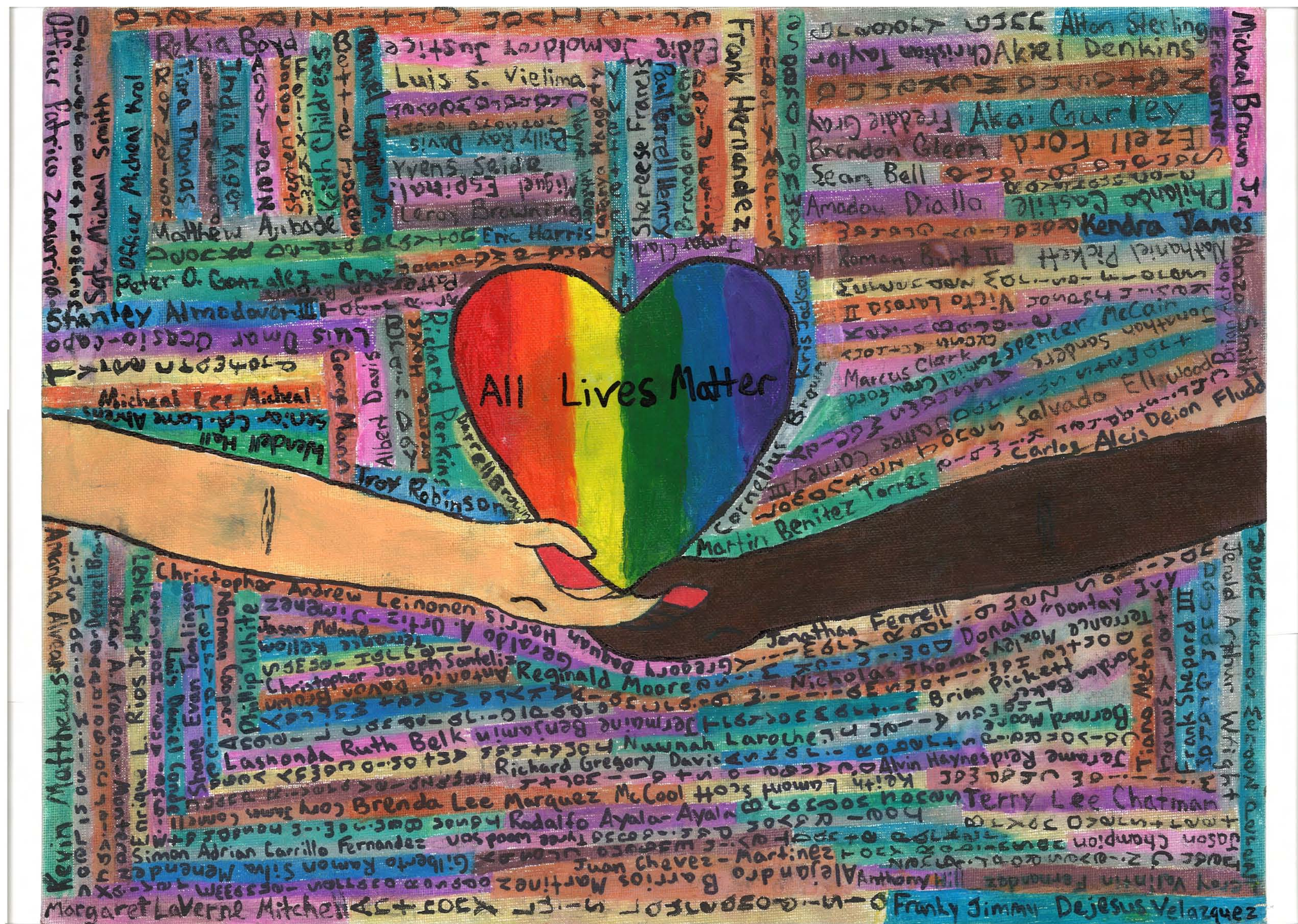




2017 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Art, Writing, & Multimedia Contest
